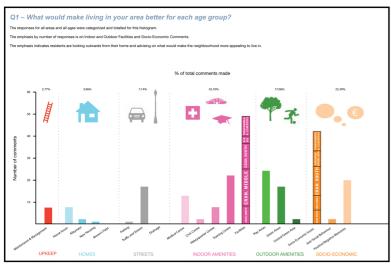

Streets

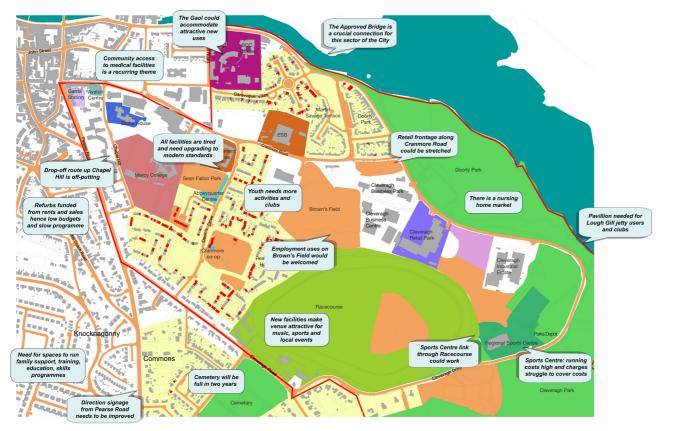
- Ramps not steps

Community Space: need for skills training and family support programmes.

Economic

The Bridge: new movement patterns will enhance profile of the quarter and may invoke need for traffic management.

The Regional Park: a city resort and regional destination but not connect to Cranmore

The Racecourse: great new facilities secures Sligo as a top event venue.

Private House Builders: the Park, Lough and Racecourse and proximity to city retail make this quarter attractive.

Employers: need incentives to invest here.

Physical

Access: the Approved Bridge will improve city wide movement and enhance the area's profile; all appreciate the impact on Doorly Park.

Image: the physical appearance of the Cranmore estate is off-putting and a reminder of its earlier reputation.

Homes & Streets: need refurbishment to modern standards and for safe movement.

Land Uses: Cranmore Road is a city street with mixed land uses that could expand eastwards to embrace employment uses on Brown's Field.

Mercy School: very good academic record; better physical integration could be negotiated.

Racecourse: new investment has transformed this wonderful Sligo destination venue.

Regional Park: new investment has raised the profile of the River, Lough and Park as destinations.

Regional Sports Centre: funding is a big issue. Bridge traffic will enhance its profile. Well used by clubs and schools.

Gaol: heritage value and workspace potential.
