1. RECOURSE TO OVERDRAFT FACILITY (NUMBER OF DAYS PER MONTH AND INTEREST INCURRED):

The overdraft interest and fees applied for the period from 19th February− to 30th December 2024 was €245,422.88.

3. OPERATION/PROGRESS OF THE LOCAL COMMUNITY AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE:

2024-2025 Local Enhancement Programme4

The Department of Rural and Community Development's Local Enhancement Programme 2025, administered by Sligo LCDC, with a total allocation of €144,393 for County Sligo was launched by Sligo County Council in February. Closing date for receipt of applications was 4pm on Friday, 21st February 2025.

Rural Development Programme (LEADER) 2023 - 2027

As at 17th February 2025, Monthly Returns in the amount of €150,863.73 for the 2023-2027 LEADER Programme have been received.

As at 17th February 2025, **19** no. LEADER Projects have been approved for the amount of **€964,859.84**.



Social Inclusion & Community Activation Programme (SICAP) 2024-2028

The overall 2025 programme budget is €968,491. The 2025 general SICAP budget is €759,192 and the allocation for New Arrivals is €209,299.

Annual KPI targets for 2025 have been agreed with Sligo LEADER Partnership CLG as follows: KPI 1 - Annual Target - 50 and KPI 2 - Annual Target - 431. 2025 annual targets to remain as per 2024 annual targets.







The Social Inclusion and Community Activation Programme (SICAP) 2018-2022 is funded by the Irish Government through the Department of Rural and Community Development and co-funded by the European Social Fund under the Programme for Employability, Inclusion and Learning (PEIL) 2014-2020

PEACEPLUS

Preparatory work to support the activation of projects included in the Sligo PEACEPLUS Action Plan is underway with the first projects under the theme Thriving and Peaceful Communities expected to be tendered in the coming weeks.

The first meeting of the Sligo PEACEPLUS Partnership for 2025 took place on the 12th February focusing on the launch of the Programme and completion of programme conditions required prior to commencement including the establishment of a Project Steering Committee to monitor the implementation of partner projects.



The Programme is a funding partnership between the European Union, the governments of the United Kingdom and Ireland, and the Northern Ireland Executive and will be administered by the Special EU Programmes Body (SEUPB).

Sligo Age Friendly Programme

Activities to promote the Sligo Age Friendly Programme continue in collaboration with Age Friendly Ireland. Development of the Age Friendly Health and Wellbeing Festival, due to take place in ATU Sligo on 28th March is ongoing.

Programmes for older people in the area of physical activity are being delivered in the county through programmes such as Health Sligo such as Stronger for Longer, Activator Poles and the Healthy Ireland Nutritional Programme.







Healthy Sligo

The Activator Poles Programme saw the participation of 80 plus people on a weekly basis partaking in this activity which aims to encourage social interaction and physical health.

This Programme has been rolled out in Doorly Park and Sligo Regional Sports Centre with a plan to roll out another in Ballymote in collaboration with Ballymote Community Library and Ballymote Family Resource Centre.



The overall activity budget for the Healthy Ireland Fund (HIF) Round 4 2023-2025 programme is €238,229.96.

Sligo PPN

On 7th February, Sligo PPN hosted SPC reps from across the whole Northwest region for a training and induction workshop on the Strategic Policy Schemes. The event was facilitated by Brian Harvey, with approximately 60 community representatives from across the region in attendance.



- On 9th February, Sligo PPN hosted their first plenary meeting of 2025. The event was held in partnership with Sligo Global Kitchen. Over 500 people were in attendance.
- On 10th February Sligo PPN Secretariat presented to the full council on opportunities for collaboration to help fulfil commitments under Sligo 2030.
- The pilot Access and Inclusion training, developed in partnership between Sligo DPO and Sligo PPN, was delivered to HSE staff and healthcare students.
- The promotional and networking event for Power to Change took place on the 27th February in the Clayton Hotel with over 200 participants in attendance.

Tourism

A Digital Marketing Training course that was curated specifically for businesses and individuals involved in tourism in Sligo was held in February. It was funded and supported by Sligo LEO.



Festivals and Events

On 17th February, the Festival and Events Oversight committee met, considered and adopted the draft Festival & Event Strategy for County Sligo. The draft Festival & Event Strategy has also been considered and adopted by SPC and is included on the Agenda for the March Plenary meeting.





Other items considered by the Committee included the Regional Festival and Event Fund grant application scheme and the operation of Queen Maeve Square.

Applications for the Regional Festival & Event Fund opened on Friday 28th February, with a closing date of 4pm Wednesday 19th March.

4. PERFORMANCE OF LOCAL ENTERPRISE OFFICES BASED ON REPORTS TO ENTERPRISE IRELAND:

Financial Supports

Grow Digital – offers small and medium businesses up to €5,000 in financial support to embrace digital technology. 1 grant was approved in the month.

Training & Events

61 people participated on various training programmes as follows:

- Introduction to E-tenders for suppliers
- A Practical Guide to Income Tax for the Creative Sector
- Start Your Own Business
- Food Starter 2025

Sligo Women in Business – Networking and Time Management event took place on 25th February in Strand Campus. 40 female entrepreneurs were in attendance.

Mentoring

24 mentoring assignments were made in February through one-to-one clinics, 3 hourly mentoring session and assignments of up to 15 hours.

Consultancy

Digital for Business – 2 assignments were made.

Economic Development

Night-time Economy – A grant was launched for projects that can support the enhancement, enrichment, and diversification of our nighttime economy. Local Enterprise Office and Sligo BID reps met with consultants carrying out a Departmental review of the NTE initiative.





AIM Centre – in partnership with AbbVie and Atlantic Technological University (ATU) Sligo, successfully hosted the inaugural VEX Robotics Northwest Regional Finals. The competition, held at ATU Sligo, saw teams from communities across Sligo, Leitrim, North Mayo, and South Donegal showcase their creativity, engineering skills, and problem-solving abilities.

Littus Programme US – Sligo County Council and Sligo Chamber of Commerce took part in an economic development visit to Mentor, OH and Philadelphia. Meetings included Northeast Ohio Port Authority, Mentor Chamber of Commerce, Healthcare and Life science providers, several digital enterprises and MAGNET- a digital manufacturing centre. A delegation from Mentor will be visiting Sligo in April.

Sligo Food & Drinks Strategy – As part of the development of the strategy a Food Sustainability Workshop was delivered on 6th February for relevant County Council Staff.

Sligo Food Hub – A Tender for the development of a Food Hub Feasibility & Strategy has been published. This project is funded under Town Centre First - Project Development Measure.
