3. OPERATION/PROGRESS OF THE LOCAL COMMUNITY AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE:

Local Enhancement Programme 2025

134 grant offers were issued to successful applicants in early June STET: €144,393. To date, 4 no. claims totalling €6,845, have been processed with payments due to issue in August.

Community & Voluntary Grants 2025

232 grant offers were issued to successful applicants in early June - total allocation: €130,000. To date, 17 no. claims totalling €10,295, have been processed with payments due to issue in August.

As in previous years it is intended to allocate the Seasonal Lights & Greening Category in Quarter 4 when groups are more focused on making seasonal applications.

2023 - 2027 LEADER Programme

As at 19th August 2025, 39 no. LEADER Projects have been approved by the LCDC / LAG to the value of €1,628,849.95. LEADER claims approved in respect of 3 no. projects, in the amount of €162,766.89

As of 19th August 2025, Monthly Returns in the amount of €271,264.51 for the 2023-27 LEADER Programme have been received.

Social Inclusion & Community Activation Programme (SICAP) 2024-2028

The 2025 SICAP Budget is €759,192. The 2025 allocation for New Arrivals is €209,299. As of the 31^{st} of August 2025, 50% of the overall budget of €968,491.00 was expended (€484,245.50).

Sligo PEACEPLUS Programme

All Pre-Commencement Conditions have been met, confirmation of obtaining 'Contracted' status is awaited from the SEUPB.

The preferred bidder has been selected for the Provision of Accounting, Audit and Financial Services, and the relevant documentation has been returned to the OGP (Office of Government Procurement) to advance the appointment process. Once the Auditor is in place, claims can be made to the SEUPB.

At the request of the SEUPB a comprehensive review of participant numbers and contact time has taken place and has been submitted to the SEUPB for approval. Projects' target numbers have not been altered and remain at 4457, it is proposed to reduce the amount of contact time on the Capital projects only.

Tendering has commenced with six of the nine soft projects advertised on eTenders. The first evaluation committee is scheduled to take place on the 27th August 2025.







Sligo Age Friendly Programme

The Sligo Age Friendly Fire Referral service launched on the 5th August 2025. The new partnership will see firefighters from the 4 fire stations in County Sligo conducting free home fire safety checks for older people, referred to them by the Healthy Age Friendly Homes Programme.





• St John's Nursing Home Sligo - Preparation for Age Friendly Status

In July, the Sligo Age Friendly Programme Manager met with the Director of Nursing and residents of St John's Nursing Home, and it was agreed they would like to proceed with gaining Age Friendly Status and a commitment was made by both organisations to collaborate on this aim.

The next step in the process is to complete the walkability audit, which is due to commence on the 3rd September, featuring service users who reflect the criteria of the audit.

Healthy Sligo

Adult Parkrun events take place on Saturday mornings at 9:30am in Doorly Park, while the Junior Parkrun follows on Sunday mornings at 9:30am, also in Doorly Park. In Tubbercurry, the Adult Parkrun is held on Sunday mornings at 9:30am. These events are free and are generously supported by volunteers, whose commitment on Sundays makes these community gatherings possible.

Stronger for Longer Programme

The "Stronger for Longer" programme completed three sessions in July at St. Molaise Gaels GAA Centre in Grange, with 45 participants. This initiative is laying a strong foundation for increased physical activity and better mental health across the county.





Activator Poles Training in Ballymote

Ballymote Library hosted Activator Poles Training for the Ballymote hinterland. The programme was well received, providing not only physical benefits but also crucial social connection which is particularly valuable in rural communities.

Creative Programmes for Down Syndrome Sligo

Down Syndrome Sligo successfully completed its first drama and music programme for young adolescents. This initiative offers a safe, inclusive space for creative self-expression.



Play Therapy Services

The Play Therapy programme has supported over 55 children and their families who are facing mental health challenges. The service is continually evaluated via the Care Opinion platform, which has returned positive feedback.

Community Engagement in Caltragh

Efforts to engage the community in Caltragh have led to meaningful improvements in the area for children and adults including the following:

- Installation of a rainwater play area and picnic bench
- Seasonal climbing plants and new flower beds, enhancing the aesthetic appeal of the area. Although the development of this shared space in Caltragh is a gradual process, the impact is already significant and continues to grow.





Yoga in the outdoors with Sligo Tourism

In collaboration with Sligo Tourism 4 outdoor Yoga classes have taken place in various locations across the county with an average of 44 people at each class. These classes were provided free for tourists and local residents in each locality.







Local Authority Integration Team (LAIT)

LAIT hosted 15 clinics with 59 attendees within International Protection Accommodation Services since the 1st of July 2025.

Over the summer LAIT has supported a number of summer camp placements for children in IPAS centres:

- 5 Cúl Camp places
- 2 Cúl Camps Inclusion Camp places
- 2 Sligo Rovers Soccer Camp places
- 5 Fitkids Gymnastics camp places
- 25 Sligo Regional Complex Multi Activity Camp places.

LAIT has arranged a workshop for International Protection Applicants this September entitled 'Understanding Your Pay and Tax'. The workshop will be facilitated by the Revenue Commissioners and is designed to give IPA's a better understanding of the pay and tax system in Ireland.

Offer a Home

The current ARP scheme payment is €600 per month; this has seen a reduction from €800 since July 2025.

Tourism

Taste of Sligo Food Festival launched

After an outstandingly successful event in their first year, the Taste of Sligo Food Festival announced a stellar line up for the 2025 festival which now extends to three days. Running from Friday 19th to Sunday 21st September the annual celebration of food brings top chefs and food producers to Queen Maeve Square in the heart of Sligo town.

South Sligo Summer School Festival Launched

The South Sligo Summer School is a well-established annual event in the traditional Irish music calendar and draws people of all ages and levels of experience to Tubbercurry from all over the world as well as from all parts of Ireland and the local area, to immerse themselves in a week of music, song and dance.

Oliver Callan RTE Radio 1 live broadcast from Strandhill

The RTE Radio 1 outside broadcast unit arrived at Strandhill and the extremely popular Oliver Callan show broadcasted live from the shorefront on Tuesday 15th July.





eGovernment Award shortlisting

The new Ideas Engine tool that creates personalised itineraries for Sligo was shortlisted for an eGovernment award in three categories. These include promoting Ireland overseas, Multilingual, internationalisation and Al in Governance



Support for travel writers and content creators

A number of travel writers and social media content creators visited Sligo in August. Sligo was promoted using the Irish language via key influencers with accounts in excess of 100,00 followers and the bespoke itineraries were designed to showcase all of the county and align with the Sligo Destination and Experience Development Plan. This content will be used for continued online promotion in 2026.









Festivals

Sligo County Council and LEO Sligo recently launched a certified Festival Management & Development Programme for local festival organisers, committee members, and volunteers. Running from September and finishing on October 4th, the training supports the long-term growth of Sligo's festival and events sector by focusing on strategic planning, sustainability, governance, inclusion, and creative excellence. The programme forms a key part of the Festival & Event Strategy Implementation Plan, developed through consultation with Bane Mullarkey Tourism Consultants and festivals across County Sligo.

Looking ahead, we will be activating the billboard at Hughes Bridge to showcase the festivals and events taking place throughout September. This approach aligns closely with Sligo's broader tourism objectives, helping to attract visitors, enhance the visitor experience, and promote the region as a vibrant cultural destination. By supporting festivals and events, Sligo not only boosts local economic activity but also strengthens its reputation as a year-round tourism hotspot.

These investments aim to strengthen the region's cultural offering, support creative innovation, and ensure long-term sustainability and growth across the sector.





4. PERFORMANCE OF LOCAL ENTERPRISE OFFICES BASED ON REPORTS TO ENTERPRISE IRELAND:

Financial Supports

Energy Efficiency Grant – 2 grants were approved for businesses in the hospitality sector during the month of July amounting to €20,000 which completes the target metric for the year. The grant supports the upgrading of equipment to energy efficient standards.

Grow Digital – the 'Grow Digital' initiative offers small and medium businesses up to €5,000 in financial support to embrace digital technology. 1 grant was approved in the period. The Grow Digital target metric for 2025 has already been surpassed.

Market Explorer Grant – 1 grant was approved. Market Explorer Grants offer 50% support up to €10,000 towards businesses developing new export markets.

Business Consultancy Supports

2 further 'Digital for Business' assignments were approved in the period, taking the 2025 total to date to 16, in excess of the annual metric assigned. 1 Green for Business (which completes the metrics for the year) and 2 further 'Lean for Business' assignments were made.





Economic Development

AIM Centre

AIM Centre has been named Ireland's National Winner in the 'Supporting the Digital Transition' category at the European Enterprise Promotion Awards 2025. This national award recognises the centres work helping small and medium enterprises across Ireland to adopt digital tools, innovate with confidence, and build resilient, future-ready businesses. AIM will represent Ireland at the SME Assembly in Copenhagen this November.

Mankato, Minnesota Ohio Economic Development Delegation

Sligo County Council's Local Enterprise Office is organising an economic development visit from a delegation from the Greater Mankato Region in Minnesota on the 15th September. The group will meet with business representatives, visit the AIM Centre, tour MSLETB Training Centre and the ATU Sligo Campus.

Business Improvement District (BID)

Sligo BID has been supported with provision of detailed information required to draft Proposal for BID renewal for 2026-2031. This has involved input from the IT and Finance Departments as well as Economic Development. Notice of intention to submit proposal for Sligo BID Renewal has been received.

Night Time Economy (NTE)

CREATE, a Creative Ireland funded project, delivered in partnership with Sligo BID, Hawk's Well Theatre, Foróige and Sligo Music Development, is offered a series of evening creative workshops that commenced on 23rd July. Planning is in progress with Sligo County Council's Arts section for Culture Night on 19th September. NTE is awaiting update from Department on Late Night Public Transport Proposal. The Purple Pulse App has 68 businesses registered with monthly reporting planned. Carnival Game evenings were programmed through the Sligo NTE Pilot in Queen Maeve Square for two Sundays in August.

SocoLab Sligo

Local Enterprise Office supported business and Socolab tenant, 'WaveWalker Films' who took home the Best Irish First Feature Award at the 37th Galway Film Fleadh in July. The film 'Horseshoe' was shot in North Sligo.
