Community & Voluntary Grant Scheme 2025

The Festival & Events Oversight Committee met on Friday, 23rd May, and recommended funding allocations for endorsement by Sligo County Council at its June Plenary Meeting.

2023 - 2027 LEADER Programme

As at 26th May 2025, 27 no. LEADER Projects have been approved by the LCDC / LAG to the value of €1,223,828.

LEADER claims approved in respect of 3 no. projects, in the amount of €162,766.

As of 26th May 2025, Monthly Returns in the amount of €228,604 for the 2023-2027 LEADER Programme have been received.



Social Inclusion & Community Activation Programme (SICAP) 2024-2028

The 2025 programme budget is €968,491. The 2025 general SICAP budget is €759,192 and the allocation for New Arrivals is €209,299. As of 26th May 2025, 40% of the overall budget has been spent.

Sligo PEACEPLUS Programme

The Sligo PEACEPLUS Local Community PEACE Action Plan was launched in City Hall on Thursday 15th May, 2025 with the welcome address by Cathaoirleach Cllr Declan Bree and official launch by Cllr Dónal Gilroy, Chair of Sligo LCDC and PEACEPLUS Partnership. Other notable speakers included Deputy Dara Calleary Minister for Social Protection and Minister for Rural and Community Development and the Gaeltacht, First Minister Michelle O'Neill and Deputy First Minister Emma Little Pengelly of the Northern Ireland Executive, Gina McIntyre, Chief Executive of the SEUPB and Kirstie McLeod, Creator of the Red Dress. The Sligo PEACEPLUS Local Community PEACE Action Plan contains 15 funded projects to be delivered by 2027.


First Irish Exhibition of the Red Dress Embroidery Project

As part of the PEACEPLUS launch celebrations at Sligo City Hall, the Red Dress Embroidery Project made its first visit to Ireland. The dress is a fitting example of collaboration, involving 381 people from 51 countries and raising the voices of those who may be excluded from society. Its exhibition during the PEACEPLUS launch aimed to promote participation and engagement in the Sligo PEACEPLUS projects, which share the same collaborative ethos as the Red Dress.

Exhibited at City Hall from 12th to 15th May, The Red Dress attracted a consistent stream of visitors, with around 600 individuals signing the visitors' book. While engaging with the exhibition, attendees were also able to explore the Sligo PEACEPLUS programme, with details of its 15 projects on display.







The Programme is a funding partnership between the European Union, the governments of the United Kingdom and Ireland, and the Northern Ireland Executive and will be administered by the Special EU Programmes Body (SEUPB).

Healthy Sligo

Healthy Sligo projects are progressing steadily and continue to attract new participants. The first in a series of mindfulness walks recently took place in Hazelwood, fostering community connection and enhancing the everyday lives of people across County Sligo.

The programme's investment in early intervention mental health services particularly those aimed at young people and families has proven highly effective in improving mental health and wellbeing.



Demand for these services continues to grow, highlighting their importance in the community.

Healthy Sligo also remains committed to promoting physical activity throughout the county. Plans are actively being developed in collaboration with partner agencies and community groups to encourage greater participation in physical activity and support healthier lifestyles across County Sligo.





Sligo Age Friendly Programme

The Sligo Age Friendly Alliance met on Tuesday, 20th May, 2025, Chaired by An Cathaoirleach Cllr Declan Bree. The Alliance is a high-level cross-sector group, which acts as a strategic partnership to develop and oversee the implementation of the Sligo Age Friendly Strategy 2023-2026.

Sligo PPN

The new facilitator for the Sligo PPN Representatives Support program
has contacted all PPN representatives and is currently organising a
network meeting in June.



- A number of Street Feast events took place across the county, supported by Sligo PPN on 24th and 25th May. The aim of the initiative is to bring communities together around food and conversation. As part of Street Feast, the first phase of the PPN New Communities Ambassador initiative began.
- The PPN has been working with Sligo DPO to create a range of templates to support community organisations to develop key governance documents in plain English and accessible language/format.
- The PPN and ATU have engaged a facilitator to undertake a national research programme exploring the pressures and challenges facing the community sector and how conflicting demands can limit the ability of the community to engage in positive climate action. The research will be rolled out across the entire PPN network in Ireland.
- The PPN Community Facilities booklet is complete. A series of printed copies will go to community centres, libraries and public buildings. There is also a searchable database on the PPN website that allows groups to search for community spaces based on specific criteria of need https://www.sligoppn.com/community-spaces/





• The Uisce Álainn festival took place on the 3rd May in partnership with PPN members Mebd's Dragon Warriors. The event featured the presentation of the Dragon Boats, a flower festival commemorating all who had been impacted by cancer, display stands, science experiments, guided walks, workshops and talks all focusing on the importance of our waters. Topics included local flora and fauna, water safety, biosecurity and citizen engagement.









 The PPN supported member group, Parkinson's Ireland, Northwest branch in hosting a hugely successful awareness and fundraising event in the Hawkswell for Parkinson's support. The longer-term aim is to set up a network of Parkinsons community organisations in the North West.

They met with tour operators and outbound agents who are actively selling the west of Ireland in Italy and also got the chance to showcase what is available to travel journalists and media. The appetite for experiences that enrich visitors was extremely strong with strong anticipation that more visitors from the Italian market will visit Sligo via the fantastic route from Milan Bergamo.

Financial Supports

Energy Efficiency Grant – 3 grants were approved for businesses in the hospitality sector during the month amounting to €28,090. The grant supports the upgrading of equipment to energy efficient standards.

Grow Digital – 1 grant was approved in the month. The grant offers small and medium businesses up to €5,000 in financial support to embrace digital technology.

Market Explorer Grant – 1 grant was approved during the month. Market Explorer Grants offer 50% support up to €10,000 towards businesses developing new export markets.

Digital Hub in Strandhill has been rebranded <u>SocoLAB</u> The campus has developed a modern workspace designed to meet the requirements of digital enterprises. Mayo, Leitrim, Sligo ETB have recently launched their <u>XRHub</u> in SocoLAB which will provide Immersive Technology training and development.

Northwest Regional Enterprise Plan Implementation Update

Vision Development/Next REP Development — The Chief Executives from Sligo, Leitrim and Donegal are collaborating to develop a Northwest Region Vision which will feed into the REP development in 2025. A working group has been established to prepare a scope of work to develop this vision.

West/Northwest Renewable/Wind energy working group — The Northwest Regional Enterprise Plan hosted the DETE Offshore Wind team in Oweninny Wind Farm for a quarterly joint meeting.

Regional marketing — As part of a collaboration between the WDC and NW REP a regional marketing tool is being developed that will map the various enterprise elements within the ecosystem which will highlight the strengths of the county. It is anticipated that it will launch in Q3.

Sligo Night Time Economy Pilot Update

It has been confirmed by the Department that the NTE pilot will be extended to Sept 2026. Fáilte Ireland are supporting a Sligo NTE marketing focused project in collaboration with Sligo Tourism Officer. Discussion is ongoing with OPW on using the Abbey for a late-night concert with Sligo Music Development. 14 projects were awarded funding under the NTE events grant.
