

EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES (PUBLIC PARTICIPATION) REGULATIONS 2010

In accordance with Section 10 of the European Communities (Public Participation) Regulations 2010, Sligo County Council wishes to advise as follows:

Planning Ref: PL17/93

Applicant: John Hallinan

Development:

A ten year permission for development consisting of: (a) erection of four wind turbines with blade tip height of 124.33m (78.33m hub height, 92m rotor diameter) (b) crane and assembly hardstand areas adjacent to each turbine (c) control room and parking spaces (d) cabling between each turbine (e) widening of existing access road and provision of new sections of access road to serve wind turbines (f) stilling ponds (g) peat reinstatement areas (h) replacement bridge across Gowlan River and realignment of approaches to the bridge (i) use of existing borrow pit and (j) all associated ancillary infrastructure. An Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and a Natura Impact Statement (NIS) have been submitted with the application.

Location of Development: Black Lough, Tawnamore, Co. Sligo

Sligo County Council made a decision to grant planning permission for the above development on the 3rd May, 2017.

The applicant and any person who made submissions or observations in writing to the Planning Authority in relation to the planning application in accordance with section 37(1) of the Planning and Development Act, 2000 – 2015 may appeal such a decision to An Bord Pleanála.

A person may question the validity of any decision of the Planning Authority by way of an application for judicial review, under Order 84 of the Rules of the Superior Courts (S.I. No. 15 of 1986), in accordance with section 50 of the Planning and Development Act 2000 as amended.

A person may question the validity of any decision on an appeal by An Bord Pleanála by way of an application for judicial review, under Order 84 of the Rules of the Superior Courts (S.I. No. 15 of 1986), in accordance with Section 50 of the Planning and Development Act, 2000 as amended.
